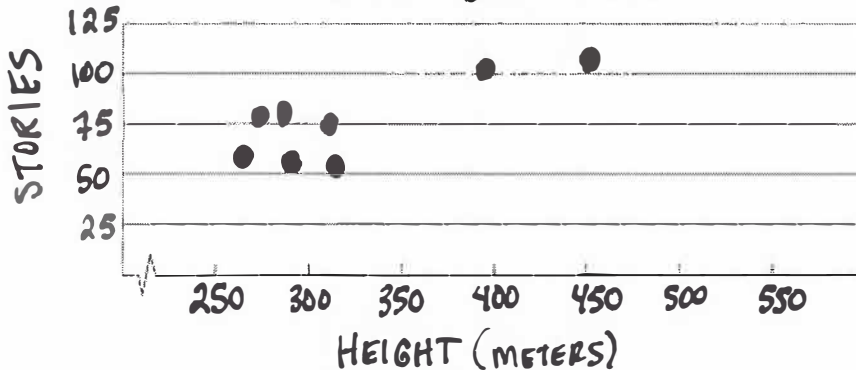
1. Use the given data to make a scatter plot.

as temp outside goes up, ice cream sold goes up

positive correlation

3. The amount of time spent in the bathtub and the temperature of the bath water

as time spent in bathtub goes up, temperature of water goes down

negative correlation

4. Use the data to predict the percent of Americans owning a home in 1955.

Percent of Americans Owning Homes

Year	1950	1960	1970	1980	1990
Percent	55.0%	61.9%	62.9%	64.4%	64.2%

In 1955, about 58 ¹⁹⁵⁵ % of Americans owned a home.
